

VATC to Join the Warrior Training Alliance

The WTA will deliver to PEO-STRI integrated, turnkey, life-cycle training services and support worldwide under an indefinite delivery-indefinite quantity contract.

Work performed by the WTA will include support for training exercises and operations; maintenance for all training and range systems; curriculum development and instruction; management oversight and administrative support for contractor activities; and supply support for all government-owned property and material.

"The WTA team is already in place at 93 percent of the Army's training sites and is proven in performance," said Richard R. Yuse, a Raytheon Company vice president and RTSC president. "This alliance is ready and will ensure training continuity to provide smooth contract transition."

The WTA has also established an innovative relationship with small businesses to take full advantage of as many entrepreneurial solutions and capabilities as possible. Small business members will benefit from collective mentoring from RTSC and CSC and

further advance their capabilities through greater access to business-to-business training opportunities provided by RTSC and CSC.
